

## **COVID-19 Update – April 7, 2020**

**NJ new positives – 3,361; new deaths – 232**

**Statewide totals: 44,416 positives and 1,232 deaths**

**Atlantic County: 16 new positives; 3 new deaths;**

**Totals to date: 156 cases countywide with 4 deaths**

**Breakdown by Municipality:** (this is not reported to public or media by Public Health)

1. PH emergency expanded another 30 days
2. All state and county parks to close as of this evening (4/7/20); municipalities are being left to make their own decision
3. Extend deadlines for Boards of Elections that have April elections
4. Waives student testing/assessment requirements for graduation

### **NJDOH**

Long Term Care facilities are being severely impacted. If each facility does not follow the

regulations, they will be called out publicly.

State is considering moving LTC residents to other facilities when staff and regulations are not available and/or being followed

24 positives, 1 staff positive in facilities for those with developmental disabilities

67 employees, 5 inmates in residential jail facilities

562 police have tested positive; 111 will return to work tomorrow; 2,941 remain self-quarantined of 36,000+ officers statewide

17,000 hospitalizations from total positive cases; this is about half of what was expected; based on models there should be 35,000

Healthcare workers cannot return to work if they are still symptomatic; they need 3 days without a fever with no fever reducing medications or 7 days without symptoms from the onset of the illness
