Sheriff Scheffler of Atlantic County started Hope One in the summer of 2018. Hope One bridges the gap when it comes to getting individuals the help they need when suffering from the disease of addiction.

Our team members work with you to understand your situation and we are strong advocates for you. The Hope One team will help answer questions you have about the process and connect you with treatment professionals. We will contact the treatment centers and assist you throughout the process. We are in the Hope One mobile outreach van 5 times a week in locations throughout Atlantic County as well as in the office.

We believe in complete wrap around care and services. We pride ourselves in following up with the individuals we help to see how they are doing and to find out if they need any assistance. **Long term recovery is our top priority** for our clients.

Recovery Story

There used to be things in this world that I thought were possible and other things that I thought were absolutely impossible. I had myself convinced that I would never live a life that knew joy or satisfaction. In fact, the impossible far outnumbered what I believed was possible. At the very top of the list of things that were not possible for me was getting clean.

I used to daydream about what it would be like to be clean. I used to imagine what it would be like to have a job, a drivers license, money, a car, a good relationship with my sons and to not have at least one warrant for more than two weeks. Getting high had become my sole motivator in life.

I once saw an interview with Robert Downey Jr on the Oprah Winfrey show. He implied that getting clean or sober is easy, it's the decision to do it that's hard. I didn't understand why he would say that for a long time but I think I do now. It takes a decision to act on faith and

seek a new life. It takes a decision to go to treatment. It takes a decision to finally go and get help.

My decision to get help began in February of 2013. I have been clean since March 3rd of 2013. Against all odds, I have been clean for over seven years. All of my warrants are gone, all of my fines are paid off, my drivers license has been valid for years and years, I have a car, my clothes are clean, I am employable, I have a relationship with my sons and the opportunity to actually feel the life around me.

I have had the opportunity to do incredible things in my time clean. I have been able to remember who I am and what I enjoy. I have made friends that feel like family, laughed so hard it hurt, traveled to different beautiful spots in the country, and stood on the top of mountains so high it was hard to breathe. I learned I love photography, writing, hiking and riding quads. There was so much life for me to find and all I had to do was decide to get help.
